SJCH named in the top 5 percent of hospitals nationwide

High standards of care. Safety. Consistency. That's just some of what it takes to be one of the nation's top hospitals.

For the second year in a row, Healthgrades® has recognized San Joaquin Community Hospital (SJCH) in the top 5 percent of U.S. hospitals for overall quality of care. SJCH also received 5-star ratings for 14 categories of care—from heart attack to stroke to pneumonia. See the full list at left.

Why are these ratings so important? They help people select hospitals that perform well. For a specific type of care, your likelihood of a good outcome can be significantly higher at a hospital with a 5-star rating.

For instance, patients treated by physicians at hospitals receiving 5-star ratings fare much better than those treated at facilities with 1-star ratings. How much better? From 2012 through 2014, if all hospitals, as a group, performed similarly to hospitals receiving 5 stars as a group, on average:

- 222,392 lives could potentially have been saved
- 166,086 complications could potentially have been avoided

Finding cancer, SAVING LIVES

It's here: Kern County's first designated Lung Cancer Screening Center

With cancer, finding it early often equals a better chance of survival—but lung cancer doesn't usually show symptoms until it's in the advanced stage. That's one reason it's the nation's leading cancer killer. Lung cancer takes more lives each year than breast, colon and prostate cancers combined.

Lung cancer screening significantly reduces lung cancer deaths. The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force recommends screenings for adults 55 to 80 years old who have a history of heavy smoking,

even if they've quit within the past 15 years.

A caring place to turn. The AIS Cancer Center at San Joaquin Community Hospital (SJCH) is the first and only hospital in Kern County to be

designated a Lung Cancer Screening Center by the American College of Radiology (ACR).

This ACR program recognizes facilities for practicing safe, effective diagnostic care for people at the highest risk for lung cancer. They must also provide follow-up care, such as counseling and smoking cessation programs.

"Our Lung Cancer Screening Center enables physicians to find lung cancer early when the disease is more likely to be cured," says AIS Cancer Center Director Melina Thorpe.

Helping you breathe easier

More top-tier rankings: *U.S. News & World Report* has rated San Joaquin Community Hospital (SJCH) as high-performing for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) care in their "Best Hospitals" for Common Care ratings.

The magazine, known for its consumer rankings, evaluated hospitals nationwide. Less than 10 percent of hospitals were rated as high-performing for COPD care.

Healthgrades® also named SJCH in the top 10 percent of U.S. hospitals for pulmonary services. According to Healthgrades, lung patients treated at

hospitals that received the Pulmonary Care Excellence Award $^{\text{\tiny M}}$ have, on average, a 46 percent lower risk of dying than if they were treated in hospitals that did not receive the award.



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In 2004–2006, the death rate from stroke was **55.7** deaths per 100,000 people.

In 2011–2013, that figure was 37.7—more than a 32% decline.



The Healthy People 2020 national health target is to reduce the stroke death rate to 34.8 deaths per 100,000 people.
